strategies and tactics of behavioral research and practice focuses on the most effective methods for measuring and evaluating changes in behavior the authors provide the rationale for different procedures for measuring behavior and designing within subject comparisons between control and intervention conditions the text explains the strengths and weaknesses of methodological alternatives for every topic so that behavioral researchers and practitioners can make the best decisions in each situation this classic text has been extensively revised to be more accessible and practical not only does it feature much more discussion of how research methods are relevant to today s practitioners it also includes additional examples based on field research and service delivery scenarios with expanded coverage on creating experimental designs as well as new chapters on behavioral assessment the statistical analysis of data and ethical issues associated with research methods this book provides a strong foundation for direct behavioral measurement within subject research design and interpretation of behavioral interventions enriched with more pedagogical features including key terms tables summarizing important points figures to help readers visualize text and updated examples and suggested readings this book is an invaluable resource for students taking courses in research methods this book is appropriate for researchers and practitioners in behavior analysis psychology education social work and other social and health science programs that address questions about behavior in research or practice settings

in may 1986 the association for behavior analysis aba established a task force on the right to effective behavioral treatment the mandate of this task force was to identify and delineate specific rights as they apply to behavioral treatment impetus for this project came in part from the controversy over the use of aversive procedures which some held had no place in treatment and with evolution of the treatment process were no longer necessary in contrast others cited evidence that programs based on positive reinforcement alone were sometimes not effective in treating severe problems these researchers and practitioners desired to ensure that clients and guardians be permitted to choose treatments that included punishment procedures when assessments warranted their use the first editor approached ogden lindsay president of aba about establishing a task force to examine this issue the aba council decided to broaden the mandate to include an examination of clients right to effective behavioral treatment in general the first editor was asked to chair the task force and appointed saul axelrod jon s bailey judith e favell richard m foxx and o ivar lovaas as members brian a iwata was appointed liaison by the aba council

navigating ethics in behavior analysis considers the elusive topic of ethics in the professional context of behavioral analysis students often assume their applied behavior analysis ethics class is going to be an easy a that it takes no more than common sense and a good moral compass to determine the line between right and wrong but as they quickly learn ethics are different from laws morals and common sense and when a variable is modified from how it was originally learned students can be at a loss for how to critically think through the situation drawing from her extensive experience in both teaching and practice nicolle carr highlights the importance of critical thinking when considering questions of ethics in behavior analysis she examines the history and creation of the behavior analysis certification board s bacb current ethical code before exploring well known and novel approaches to navigating the ethical decision making process with added emphasis on contextual understanding these approaches are then applied in real world scenarios in schools clinics homes residential facilities higher education and within organizational behavior management carr concludes by walking the reader through the process of an ethical violation from trying to solve an issue alone and ensuring the person falls under the bacb s jurisdiction to submitting the appropriate documents and what to expect as the process continues delving into the ethical curiosity created by grey areas that play out daily in the world of behavior analysis this book will be an essential resource for students of behavioral analysis ethics as well as fully certified behavioral analysts
